

## **Nécrologie**

### **Geneviève Wilkinson**

The last day of 1994 robbed afls of a member who contributed very actively to some of its projects. Geneviève Wilkinson was killed in a car crash a few hundred metres from her home in Hull.

Geneviève was part of that cohort of French women settled in Britain without whom the teaching of French in this country would be very much the poorer. Born Geneviève Martin, brought up and educated in the Midi, whose accent she never lost, she came to England initially as an assistante in a Hull school. There she met a young French teacher, David Wilkinson, and began a 35-year partnership which was brought to an abrupt end by her accident.

Her early professional career was in secondary, further and adult education; she became a university teacher relatively late in life. Employed by Hull University initially as a part-time lectrice in the 80s, she soon took on other responsibilities and, with her quiet efficiency, became a very valued member of her School. In recent years she had become the French Department's specialist in fsp, taking part in the teaching of business French, and in particular developing considerable expertise in the teaching of French to scientists: on the shelves in her office, Byrne, Churchill & Price sat next to French textbooks in Mathematics and Chemistry. She was a sympathetic and at the same time meticulous teacher, who demanded high standards of herself and of her students, whether they be undergraduates or teachers on an inset course. All those who knew her held her in affection, and her students are as shattered by her death as her colleagues.

Geneviève will be missed not only by colleagues in Hull, but also by our Association. She was an active and productive member of two of the teams who wrote grammar booklets under the Projects and Publications' Committee's Grammar Initiative, and with one of these had just started preparing materials for publication. She was valued not only for her solid work but also for the original ideas she was able to contribute to any project. She enjoyed afls conferences and workshops, and though she spoke little in large groups, what she said was always pertinent and clear. Working with her was a pleasure.

We grieve with her husband and four children, and extend to them our warm sympathy.
